# EMERGENCY HEALTH

IOM has provided lifesaving health and nutrition assistance to over **100,000** IDPs, refugees, returnees and vulnerable members of host communities throughout Darfur. The services provided were part of the Minimum Basic Health Package (MBHP) and included: Outpatient Treatment (OTP) of acute and chronic communicable and non-communicable diseases; basic maternal care such as Antenatal Care (ANC) and promotion of safe pregnancies and deliveries; child health services including screening and Community-Based Management of Acute Malnutrition (CMAM) and immunizations, and facilitation of referrals. In addition, community mobilization activities and health promotion activities were also implemented.

## IOM provided health and nutrition assistance to over 100,000 beneficiaries

### IOM Managed Health Clinics:



**37,389** beneficiaries received direct medical consultations through 3 fixed clinics managed by IOM (1 in South Darfur and 2 in North Darfur) and 3 mobile clinics (1 in East Darfur and 2 in North Darfur), from January to June 2017.



**13,335** children under 5 years (U5s) were assessed for malnutrition using Middle Upper Arm Circumference (MUAC) screenings, and cases of malnutrition with referrals to outpatient or inpatient care, or via CMAM.



**6,761** children under 5 years (U5s) were vaccinated through implementation of the Expanded Program on Immunization (EPI).



**3,777** pregnant women received ANC services.



**460** female dignity kits were distributed to vulnerable IDPs and refugees, in Allait, North Darfur State, as part of the awareness campaigns on hygiene and reproductive health.



**209** births were assisted by skilled attendants including referrals for obstetric emergencies.

### Trainings, Awareness Programs and Capacity Building

Health workers (including staff and community health workers) were trained on general health topics, such as conducting MUAC screenings, CMAM, and good nutrition practices.

Beneficiaries were reached via Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials as part of several health promotion activities conducted by health workers who were trained by IOM.

Temporary outpatient rooms were constructed in El Ferdous, East Darfur State, to facilitate provision of outpatient care.

### IOM Managed Nutrition Clinics:

To contribute towards reduction of morbidity and mortality associated with malnutrition, IOM in close coordination with partners, ran 4 nutrition clinics (3 in West Darfur, and 1 in North Darfur).

U5s were screened through mass and routine MUAC campaigns.

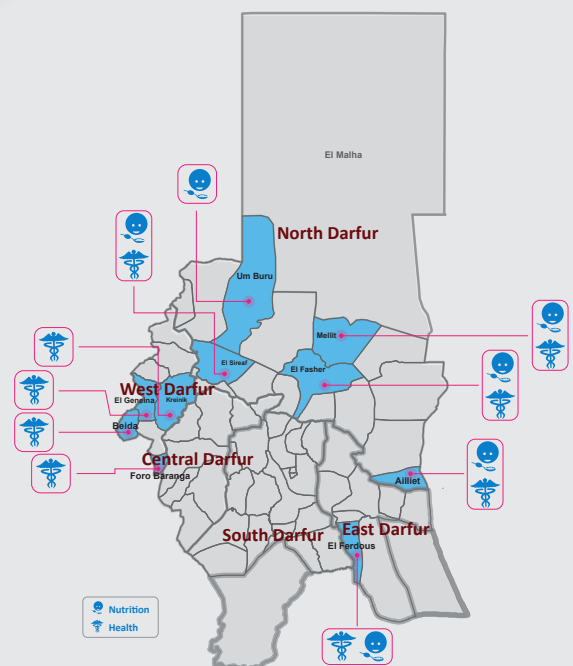
U5s received support for the management of Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) and Moderate Acute Malnutrition (MAM).

Caregivers were provided with information on how to improve Infant and Young Child Feeding (IYCF) practices through 10 caregiver support groups.

Beneficiaries reached through 11 awareness raising campaigns on health and nutrition topics.



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
