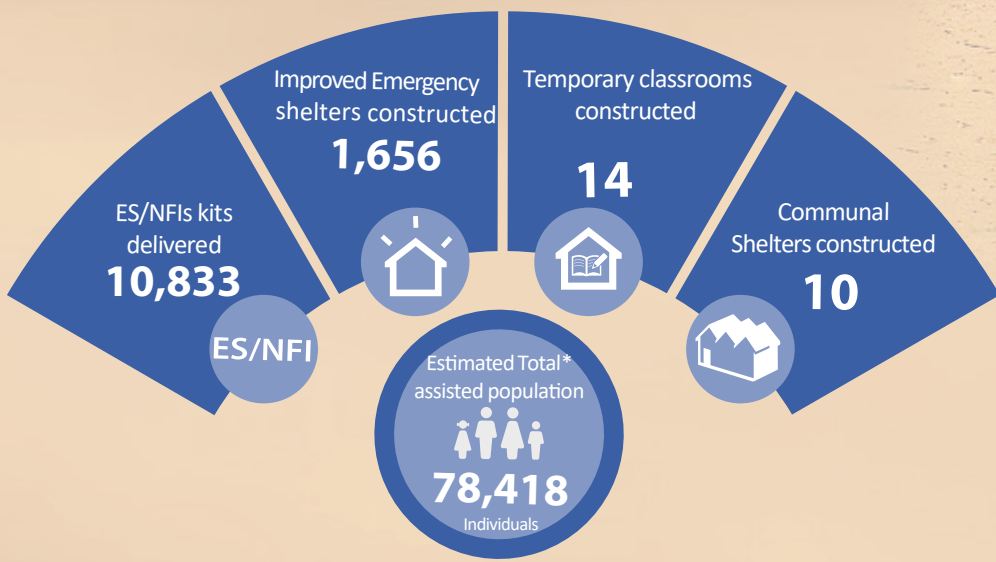




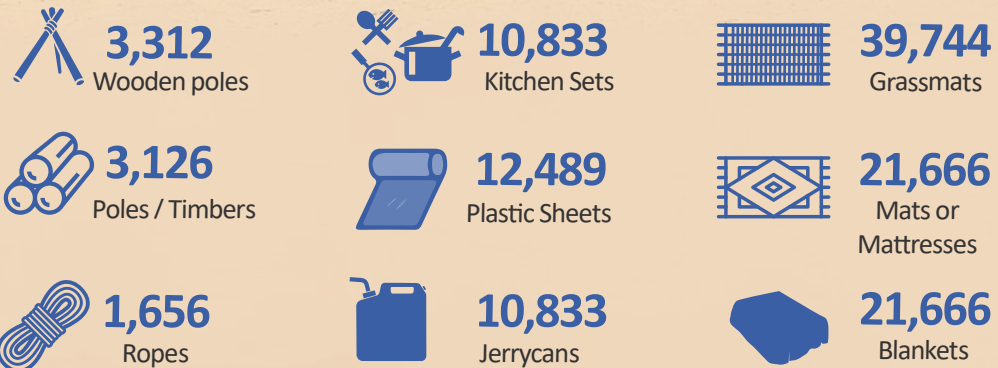
PROVIDING SHELTER AND NON-FOOD ITEMS IN SUDAN HIGHLIGHTS 2016

Through IOM Sudan's Shelter and Non-Food Items projects, **78,418** beneficiaries including Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs), returnees and vulnerable disaster affected populations in North, South and West Darfur States received Emergency Shelters and Non Food Items (ES/NFIs). ES/NFI support comprises of Improved Emergency Shelters (IES), communal shelters and temporary classrooms. Of the assisted beneficiaries, 72% were IDPs, most of which were newly displaced as a result of crisis and natural disasters. Returnees comprised of 27% of the assisted caseload, while vulnerable host communities comprised of only 1% of the total number of beneficiaries assisted in 2016. In addition to shelter and lifesaving ES/NFI response, IOM adapted its Improved Emergency Shelters to construct temporary classrooms – which can be quickly erected in IDP sites/Camps to provide a covered and safe educational space. In 2016, at least 879 primary school children and teachers benefited from temporary classrooms constructed by IOM's ES/NFI team. IOM Sudan's shelter and Non-Food Items projects are implemented in close coordination with the ES/NFI sector lead and the Humanitarian Aid Commission as well as the Education sector and the State Ministry of Education for the construction of temporary classrooms.
