## Introduction:

The expulsion of Sudanese migrants working in the gold mines in the Tibesti region in Chad began on 11 August with clashes and deadly attacks between Chadian and foreign miners. Subsequently, over 5,000 Sudanese expelled migrants arrived in North (Tina Locality) and West Darfur (El Geneina) (2000 in North Darfur, 3640 confirmed in West Darfur); more arrivals are expected in the coming days..

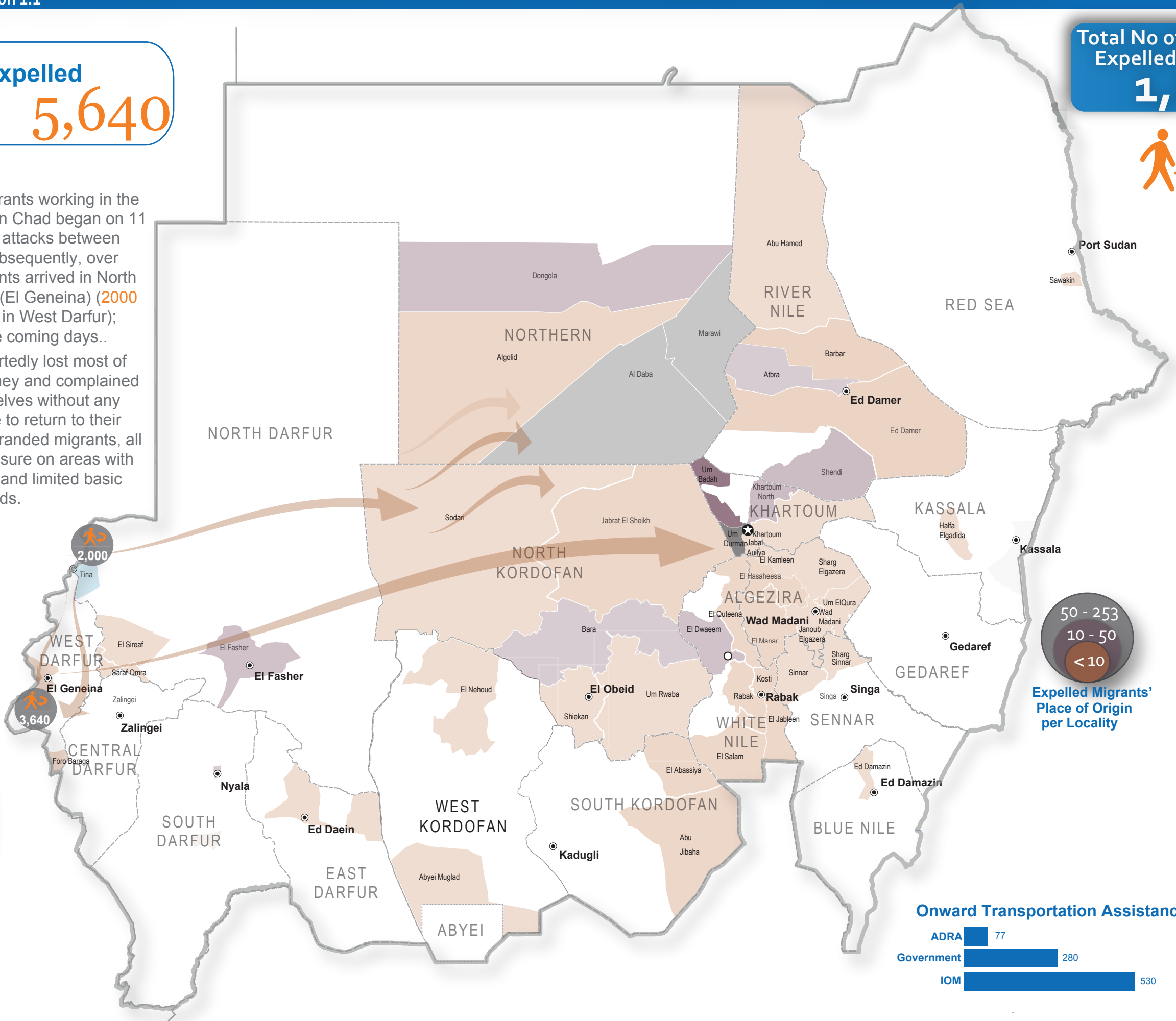
Many of the migrants have reportedly lost most of their belongings during the journey and complained of looting. They now find themselves without any financial support and are unable to return to their points of origin in Sudan. The stranded migrants, all men, are putting significant pressure on areas with an on-going humanitarian crisis and limited basic services to respond to such needs.

**Total No of Stranded Expelled Migrants 2,200**

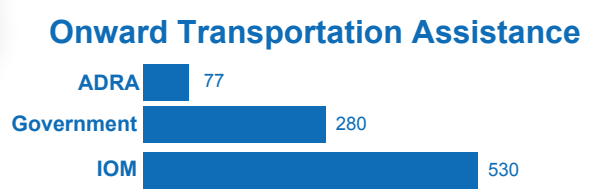
