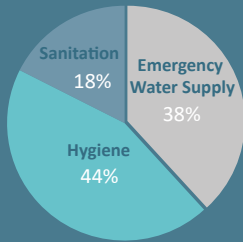

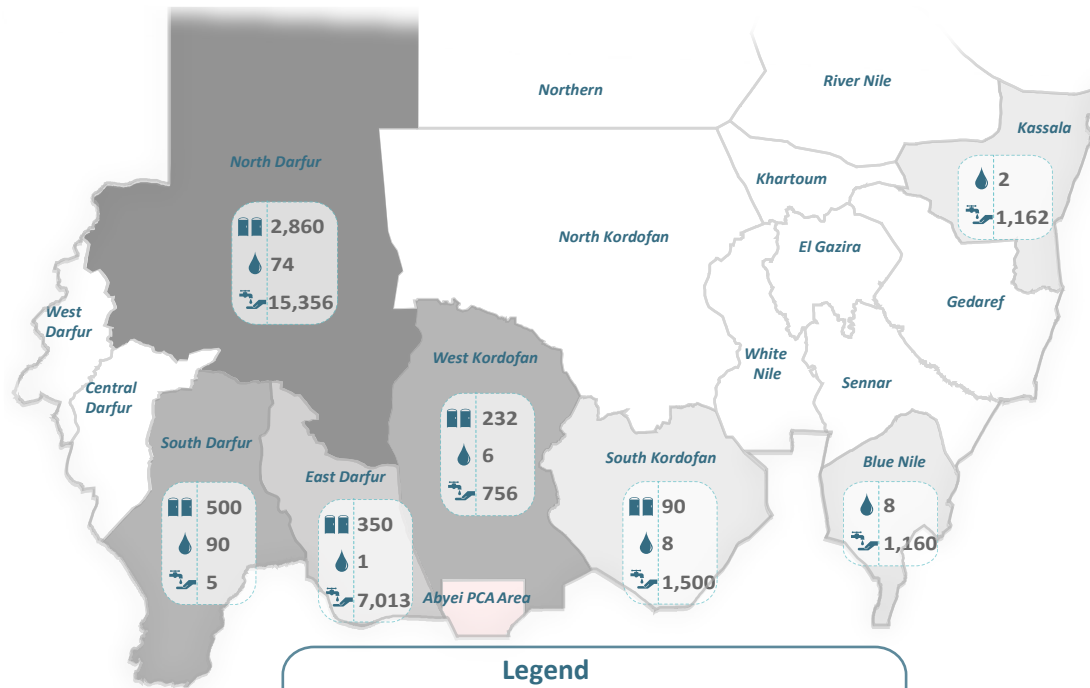

## 2016 Emergency Response

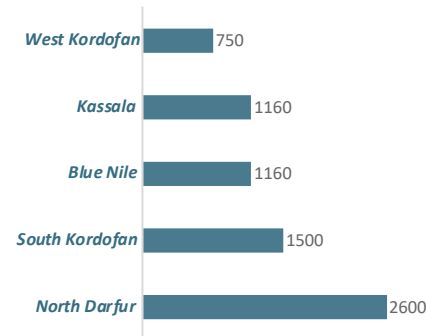
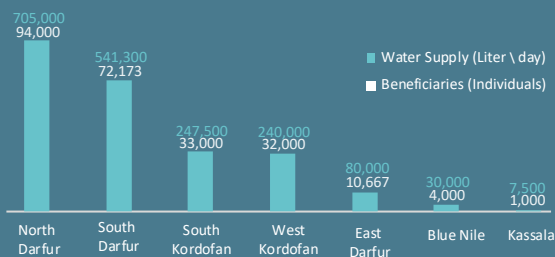
### Water trucking

IOM provided water trucking services in response to the North Darfur emergency in Tawilla locality. **240,000** liters of water were delivered on a daily basis for 75 days reaching over **31,000** beneficiaries.

### Water purification kits
